<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw information from a simple map. • Understand that some places are special to members of their community. • Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways. • Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries. • Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live. 						
<p>In Year 5 & 6 we will learn to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand and use 'le/la' or 'un/une' appropriately to match the gender of a noun in spoken and written French. • Recognise simple grammar such as some nouns having irregular plurals. • Recognise that adjectives' endings often change to match the noun they are describing. • Understand the meaning and recognise the difference between 'mon', 'ma' and 'mes'. • Read a story aloud, understanding the main points. • Sing songs clearly with expression and accurate pronunciation. • Read French carefully and pronounce unfamiliar words and phrases with accuracy. • Join in with a short continuous conversation. • Adapt familiar sentences by changing a few words and build new sentences using a modelled example. • Express opinions in writing using complex sentences with conjunction such as 'parce que...', 'et' and 'mais'. • Prepare a short talk about a familiar subject – a place, a person or an object – presenting it clearly and confidently. • Prepare several sentences from memory to describe a place; a person; an object or what other people like doing using verbs in the third person. • Use French articles confidently and accurately. • Appreciate why certain words have been used in stories, poems or songs that are spoken or written. • Use a range of spoken language confidently, using accurate pronunciation and intonation, such as in a role-play. • Use familiar words to build new sentences in French using longer, more complex sentences and different vocabulary. • Understand the main points and some of the detail in a short passage that contains some unfamiliar language. • Write a short passage from memory and include longer or more complex sentences. • Write sentences with regular French nouns in the singular and plural form and include some simple adjectives. • Recognise that 'vous' is used for more than one person/in a formal situation, and 'tu' is informal and is used for one person. • Identify and write some simple sentences using the future tense, with help. • Recognise the 'vous', 'ils' and 'elles' form of verbs in the present tense. • Recognise that some verbs are irregular and write them in the correct form using the first and third person singular. • Join in with a longer conversation giving reasons for my opinions using longer, complex sentences. • Recognise the past tense of verbs and talk about what I have done using the past tense.

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MFL (French) Enrichment

- Our children not only learn to read, write and speak another language, but we offer wider cultural experiences such as learning about the French national holiday - Bastille Day – which is celebrated each July.
